The Retired and Senior Volunteer Program of Kane, Kendall to dialysis, cancer treatments, & McHenry Counties concluded their grant year March 31, 2015, reporting 127,246 hours of service to the communities they serve, with assistance of 840 volunteers in the three-county service area.

Volunteers participating in RSVP are all 55 years of age or older. They are able to give back to their community with time earned knowledge or talents, or explore new avenues of service, in the program, which is the most diverse service component of the national Senior Corps. The RSVP grant report showcases the impact of volunteer involvement in the threecounty area in several key service areas: Aging in Place assistance in companionship, transportation, and food delivery, access to care through information, assisting in bone building, and offering assistance to those in need due to obesity or

Regarding Aging In Place and assistance in companionship, 87 RSVP volunteers gave a total of 6,795 service hours, making weekly visits and friendly phone calls to 90 isolated seniors in the three-county area.

Regarding Aging In Place assistance through transportation, 184 RSVP volunteers gave over 6,500 hours of service as they

assisted approximately 500 seniors. Those seniors in need were given 6,475 one-way rides grocery shopping, or other important appointments. The volunteers served through Senior Services Transportation Program, Senior Care Volunteer Network and Batavia's Transportation Program.

Regarding Aging In Place and assistance in Food Delivery, along with many other volunteers, 31 RSVP volunteers assisted with delivering meals to homebound seniors and reported 2,517 service hours.

Looking at Access to Care for seniors and the need to distribute information, 19 RSVP volunteers provided 590 hours of service as SHIP counselors at three locations. These volunteers assisted Senior Services staff which work with the senior population to help them apply for various programs such as the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP), the Illinois Real **Estate Transfer Declaration** (PTAX), and the Illinois Department on Aging Benefit Access Application (BAA).

Volunteers gave service in Access to Care Leading or Assisting with Bone Builders. Twelve RSVP volunteers reported 590 service hours, as they alongside Senior Services staff members coached 93 seniors in Matter of Balance and

Fit & Strong evidence-based classes.

And in looking towards better health in the areas of Obesity and Food, 135 RSVP volunteers provided almost 27,000 hours of service at 10 food pantries.

Aurora Interfaith Food Pantry Partners with RSVP

Aurora Interfaith Food Pantry has partnered with the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program of Kane, Kendall & McHenry Counties in order to connect with active volunteers looking for meaningful service projects.

Since 1981, concerned citizens in the Aurora area have attempted to provide canned goods and other groceries to persons in need of food assistance. That movement, known as the Aurora Area Interfaith Food Pantry, has seen substantial increases in the requests from year to year. Those who receive food include the unemployed, families and single parents caring for children, seniors on

fixed incomes, persons with disabilities or chronic illness, victims of violence and emergency situations, employed individuals who still are in need of supplemental food supplies, or anyone who cannot afford to purchase enough food to adequately meet their nutritional needs.

The Pantry distributes food on Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday, from 11am to 2pm. Volunteers are needed to assist on distribution days, with parking of clients, shopping assistants, front desk registration and reception, child care for clients

while waiting and shopping, stocking of shelves, and other duties.

RSVP program saved seniors over \$1.9 million in fees and helped return over \$5 million in tax returns

Retired and Senior Volunteer Program Volunteers helped seniors in the State of Illinois save over \$5 million dollars this year!

Yes, that's right. Through the Tax Assistance Program, volunteers with RSVP served at local senior centers throughout the state, and throughout the income tax season. The volunteers assisted seniors with preparing and filing their income tax documents in this free program.

Locally, through RSVP of Kane, Kendall and McHenry Counties, free income tax assistance appointments were offered throughout tax season at each of the senior centers operated by Senior Services Associates, the sponsoring agency. A total of 3,094 seniors were assisted with their tax preparation and filing. The senior clients combined tax returns totaled \$742,560.00.

Illinois currently benefits from just 18 RSVP programs, which offer volunteer opportunities for seniors aged 55 and older, in a variety of service avenues, from delivering meals and visiting isolated seniors, to manning food pantries, and helping in local non-profits. The RSVP Tax Assistance Program incorporates the volunteer service of just a small portion of the state's RSVP volunteers. Dedicated volunteer tax assistants, in nine of the state's 18 RSVP programs, helped 8,306 seniors prepare their taxes, bringing returns totaling \$5,037,469.00 back to the seniors to spend in their communities, an average of about \$626.00 per client.

In 2014, the average tax preparation fee was \$240.00 per client according to date provided by http://www.cpapracticeadvisor.com/news/12065684/average-income-tax-preparation-fees-increased-in-2015. Based on



those calculations, RSVP volunteer tax assistants saved the 8,306 participants a total of \$1,993,440.00 for their 2014 income tax preparations alone.

The RSVP programs which participated in the free income tax assistance program include: RSVP of Coles County, RSVP Adams, Brown & Pike Counties, RSVP Sangamon & Menard, RSVP of Kane, Kendall & McHenry Counties, RSVP of NW Suburban Chicago, RSVP of the Belleville Area, RSVP of Champaign, Douglas & Piatt Counties, RSVP of Western Cook & Northern DuPage, and RSVP of McLean County.

The Retired and Senior Volunteer Program, RSVP, is a national initiative of the Senior Corps, celebrating over 40 years of service.
